


Bow Brickhill Burns Supper

Increasing participation in football through inspiration

Regular readers of this column will no doubt recall the massive inspiration and motivation provided to Woburn & Wavendon FC's grassroots footballers by Ben Chilwell, the former WWFC player who now features for both Chelsea and England.



But it's not only playing careers that can start at your local community football club. Gregg Broughton is currently Director of Football at Championship club, Blackburn Rovers. He is responsible "for the club's overcoaching football strategy including the first team, academy, recruitment, medical, athletic performance and analysis". But it all started as a grassroots

coach at WWFC (then Woburn Lions). Gregg went on to be Academy Manager at Luton Town, Head of Academy

Recruitment at Norwich City, before becoming Academy Director at Norwegian side Bodo/Glimt. He holds both the UEFA Pro Licence and FA Technical Director qualifications – quite a journey from where it all started as youth football coach with the Lions!

Today all WWFC coaches have the opportunity to gain their FA Level 1 coaching qualification which the Club funds. Many coaches go on to extend and develop their coaching badges, which not only helps them to develop their skills and expertise, but also provides the foundations for possible career progression in the sport. But whatever level of coaching reached, WWFC provides the ideal opportunity to get involved in grassroots community football – whatever your current level of knowledge.

The areas largest and oldest grassroots football club has a number of teams based at Bow brickhill Playing Fields, and not only welcomes volunteers for all sorts of other roles, but also players of all abilities and ages for our mixed, boys, girls and adult teams.

The King visits Milton Keynes

On Thursday 16 February, The King attended a celebratory reception at Milton Keynes' Church of Christ the Cornerstone to mark Milton Keynes' new status as a city, awarded as part of The late Queen's Platinum Jubilee celebrations. During the afternoon reception, The King met a range of community groups representing charitable, business, faith, environmental and arts organisations.

A dedicated space was made available outside the Church for local people to greet the arrival of The Royal Party.

SUEZ recycling and recovery UK named new contractor for Milton Keynes City Council waste and environmental services - The contract starts in September 2023



Milton Keynes City Council has awarded a new contract to SUEZ Recycling and Recovery UK Ltd to collect MK's waste, keep streets clean, and maintain council owned green spaces and play areas.

The contract starts in **September 2023** alongside the vast majority of Milton Keynes 119,000 households moving to wheelie bins, following a public consultation where three quarters of those local people who responded chose wheelie bins over plastic sacks. Introducing wheelie bins should lead to less street litter, a reduced food supply for rodents and, importantly, higher recycling rates, which will be better for the environment and saves on the production of millions of plastic sacks.

Broadband in Bow Brickhill

I understand that as part of the Government's upcoming BDUK Project Gigabit a new initiative is going to start in the Spring. I have asked Iain Stewart MP for his help in trying to get the remaining parts of Bow Brickhill upgraded to full fibre broadband. It does seem inequitable that this is still a problem in Bow Brickhill, particularly when new property being built will have this facility. The officer responsible for this project at Milton Keynes City Council has sent me this response, though I am afraid it is not particularly encouraging:

I can confirm that I have been working closely with colleagues in BDUK to ensure that all the areas of Milton Keynes that have yet to benefit from advanced fibre broadband are included, and hence, are considered for potential investment during the upcoming BDUK Project Gigabit procurement. Clearly, until the procurement has been completed we won't know whether the successful supplier has included Bow Brickhill in its bid. I'll be in touch once I have more information on the outcome of the Project Gigabit procurement.
