# **April Bow Brickhill Parish Council Summary**

A delegation from the Downs View action group attended to discuss the problem of access being given for caravans through the right of way between 9 & 10 Downs View.

It was pointed out that no planning permission existed on the land and there is an Article 4 Direction in place since 2005 which severely restricts what can be done on the land. The action group are holding a public meeting to discuss the issues. Although the Parish Council understood and appreciated the concerns of residents, at this stage ahead of any occupation of the land, the council had no legal power to take any action. The Council did offer its support going forwards. It was however highlighted that the land could be included in future local plans for development but this would be a matter at a later stage.

Fly tipping in Church Road had been extensive and although MKCC attended rapidly to clear up the mess, it had been suggested that a camera should be set up to deter others from doing the same. Cllr Hopkins and the Chairman are in conversation with MKCC to see how this can be achieved.

Cllr Ball updated the meeting on the Areas of Attractive Landscape review with the following points: MKCC had engaged consultants LUC in relation to this matter and a consultation exercise had been completed. The Parish Council had encouraged and supported residents and responded to this consultation. Feedback had supported the desire to have the Brickhill's landscape protected in some way as was the case previously. The consultation report was expected shortly. It was however highlighted that a designation may not provide complete protection but the planning authority would be required to pay it some regard. This matter is likely to form part of formal local plan consultation in the autumn.

# We're piloting changes to MK Connect

A new pilot scheme starting on Monday 8 April will change the way some people use MK Connect, our on-demand transportation network.

Some people who use MK Connect to travel from the rural areas of Northern Milton Keynes (such as Olney and Lavendon) tell us they can wait up to 70 minutes to be collected. We hope to bring that wait time down.

### What's changing?

For the next six months we will be running a pilot scheme where Milton Keynes is split into three zones for MK Connect journeys: a rural zone, a zone for Newport Pagnell, and a zone for the rest of the city.

Instead of covering the whole of Milton Keynes, MK Connect drivers will serve one or two zones, which means they can collect passengers far more quickly. We hope to cut the wait time in rural areas from up to 70 minutes to up to 15 minutes.

This does mean that some passengers travelling to or from rural areas will have their journey broken into two parts. Both parts might be in an MK Connect vehicle, or it might mean transferring to a bus.

The pilot is to determine whether people prefer a faster journey where they



change vehicle, or a slower journey where they don't need to, so we can make informed decisions for the future.

### You won't be charged twice

Anyone asked to change vehicle to complete their journey will only pay for one part of their trip.

### Times:

Monday to Friday between 6am and 7pm and Saturdays between 8am and 6pm. Outside of these hours and on Sundays, you'll be collected and dropped off by a single MK Collect vehicle with no need to change.
