We are very pleased to share with you the results of our Ofsted inspection following their visit which took place on the 18<sup>th</sup> June. Our one day inspection confirmed that Bow Brickhill CofE Primary School continues to be a 'Good' school and acknowledges the excellent behaviour of the children, the positive relationships between pupils and staff and our ambitious curriculum.

The report contains many glowing comments which make us very proud of our school community who all learn and work within it. It is fantastic to see that both pupils and staff are mentioned in an extremely positive manner within the first paragraph and that the school values of respect, responsibility and kindness were clear for the inspectors to see. The report also recognises the strong start our pupils make in Reception and acknowledges that every pupil in school achieves well in reading, writing and mathematics.

In addition to this good news we are also pleased to share that our we are very happy with our end of KS2 SATS results which are a reflection of the children's hard work and the high quality of teaching and support from the staff during the children's time at our school.

# Saturday 14 September 10.00 a.m. - 4.00 p.m.


All Saints Church will be open as part of the Heritage Open Days and the Bucks Historic Churches Ride & Stride on Saturday 14 September from 10am to 4pm.
